Economic

This pillar focuses on ensuring sustained and inclusive economic growth that generates employment opportunities and improves the standard of living. However, it must be achieved without compromising environmental and social welfare, considering the long-term effects of economic activities.

Relevant references:

- **Sustainable Development Goal 8** (UN 2030 Agenda): Promote sustained, inclusive economic growth and decent work.
- **International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (ICESCR), Article 6**: Right to work.

Social
